Unfortunately, the ruptured gas line caused numerous families to be evacuated from their homes. Fitzgerald C.O.P. coordinator Pat Struble came across a neighbor who had just arrived home, only to find out that she could not enter her residence. Pat brought the lady into her residence, fed her and gave her a place to stay until the gas line had been repaired.

“Having a Community Watch in the neighborhood does make a difference,” Pat stated. In the end, the bad guy got caught and neighbors pulled together to assist each other through a potentially unsafe incident.
